Junior Economist (Ph.D. Student, 75%)

at Hamburg Institute of International Economics (HWI) as soon as possible. The position is initially available for three years.

The HWI is an independent, privately financed economic research institute that works closely with the Helmut Schmidt University in Hamburg. We are not only closely networked with the scientific community, but are also in close contact with business and politics. The HWI conducts application-oriented empirical economic research and aims to actively participate in economic policy debates on the basis of its own research activities.

We are looking for a junior researcher for our research department "Business Cycles and Growth". The responsibilities include conducting own research with a macroeconomic focus and applying for and carrying out third-party funded projects. We expect candidates to gain further academic qualifications (Ph.D.).

We offer the opportunity to work in a young and innovative research team with short decision-making paths and the opportunity to actively participate in the further development of our institute. We primarily conduct research using modern econometric methods on issues relevant to economic policy.

We expect an above average master degree in the field of economics or another quantitatively oriented social science field as well as broad knowledge of economic policy, in particular macroeconomics. Very good knowledge in the application of empirical methods as well as very good German and English language skills are also required. A strong ability to work in a team is essential, too.

Programming skills in the statistical software R are desirable, or at least the willingness to learn it

quickly.
